

TOGETHER AGAIN FOR WORSHIP



I am pleased to let you know that it is now possible for in person Sunday worship services to resume from Sunday 4th April 2021. For the past three months the Presbyterian Church in Ireland together with other denominations have voluntarily suspended in person worship services along with all other indoor church-based gatherings. With the encouraging signs of reduced transmission rate, levels of infection and hospital admission together with the successful roll out of the vaccination program, congregations are able to resume in person worship services as a first step out of this period of voluntary lockdown.

The Kirk Session, having considered the guidance from PCI together with the most recent statements from NI Executive, have agreed to resume worship services from Easter Sunday 4th April 2021 on the following basis:

A worship service will take place at 11am on 4th April 2021 (Please note that we are not yet in a position to offer Communion at our Sunday service) and thereafter each Sunday at the same time.

Numbers will be limited due to social distancing measures and therefore everyone attending MUST register IN ADVANCE by emailing the Church Office by mid-day Wednesday of each week or telephoning the Church Office on Wednesday mornings between 9:30am and 12 noon

Everyone attending worship is required to wear a mask or face covering entering and exiting the building and during the worship service.

Hand sanitiser will be available and everyone entering the building will be asked to register their attendance

Those attending are asked to avoid gathering in clusters before or after the service either in the vestibule/entrance area or the car park. Social distancing and the wearing of masks is advised while on the grounds of the church before and after the service.
